He was founder and president of The First Aid Company.

In 1989, Mr. Movius and his wife purchased a 1963 ChrisCraft Constellation and lived aboard it.

An ardent fisherman and hunter, he spent many hours in the Strait of Juan de Fuca, the Kenai River and the waters of Sitka, Alaska.

He was also a Seattle

Mariners fan and enjoyed spring training.

Survivors include his wife of Brinnon; sons and daughtersin-law, Mike and Denise and Dale and Helen, all of Olympia; and five grandchildren.
