He worked as a wireman out of Local 46 until he went to work at Puget Power as a Sub Station wireman. He was the Business Mgr. for his Lineman Local 77 from 1985 to 1987. He stayed politically active for 40 years. He was Chr. of the Mental Health Mental Retardation Board. He worked on many democratic campaigns, keeping a close eye on the legislature and senate's views so he could help support the disabled and working people's causes. He was Kitsap County Demo Chr. from 1974 to 1978. Then State Chr. until 19981. This year he was the political coordinator for the Kerry, Edwards campaign through his union. Joe was a life long member of the Masonic Lodge and the Shriners.

Joe was very proud to be the father of 4 children. Jim of Bremerton, Teri of Poulsbo, Joe and his wife Debbie of Poulsbo and Bobby of Bremerton, and 2 adopted sons Trung and wife Lana, Tin and wife Trang Pham. Joe is grandpa to 13 grand children, Jackie, Tyler, Joe, Katie, Timmy, Lisa, Patrick, Tommy, Danny, Lynda, Vicky, Jason, and Michelle.

Joe was a wonderful family man and one of the reasons for this was he came from a family of 10 children. His father Joe Sr. moved to Poulsbo and was able to spend 20 years of quality fishing with Joe. His mother Lorraine taught him to be dedicated to his family and have a high work ethic, for which he loved and respected her for.
